

Black Forest Mousse Dessert

1 pkg. (3.9 oz.) JELL-O Chocolate Instant Pudding 1-1/2 cups cold milk

1 tub (8 oz.) COOL WHIP Whipped Topping, thawed, divided

16 Oreo cookies, coarsely crushed (about 1 1/2 cups), divided

1-1/2 cups of cherry pie filling

Beat pudding mix and milk in medium bowl with whisk 2 min. Stir in 1 cup COOL WHIP. Reserve 1/2 cup of cookie crumbs; stir remaining crumbs into pudding mixture. Spoon half into 1-1/2 qt. serving bowl. Top with layers of 1 cup each of the remaining COOL WHIP and pie filling. Cover with layers of remaining pudding mixture, COOL WHIP, pie filling and reserved cookie crumbs. If using a trifle bowl, double the recipe in order to fill the bowl. Makes 12 servings, 1/2 cup each.

of finger food and drinks. This was topped off with an excellent "Merry Christmas Village Landlords" cake.




