

> Cruz, the representative of Department 56 (originally scheduled for February), was gracious enough to be our guest speaker this month.


Felix spoke to the club on D-56 items of interest. He informed the club on new products and answered questions from the group.

Rice Pudding with Currants

4 cups milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

½ cup uncooked regular rice

1 teaspoon finely shredded orange peel

½ cup sugar, a pinch of salt

½ cup currants

Whipping cream

Heat oven to 300 degrees. Mix all ingredients except whipping cream. Pour into a buttered 2-quart soufflé dish or casserole.

Bake uncovered, stirring occasionally for 2 hours. Continue to bake without stirring 20 to 30 minutes longer or until set and lightly browned. Serve warm. Pour whipping cream over each serving.




