Hi Everyone,

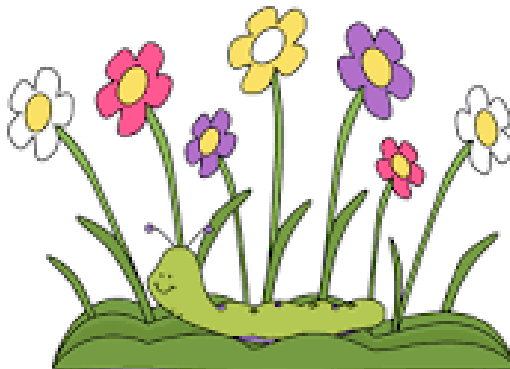

MEETING DEMONSTRATION FOR FEBRUARY 2017

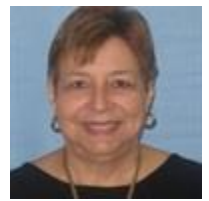

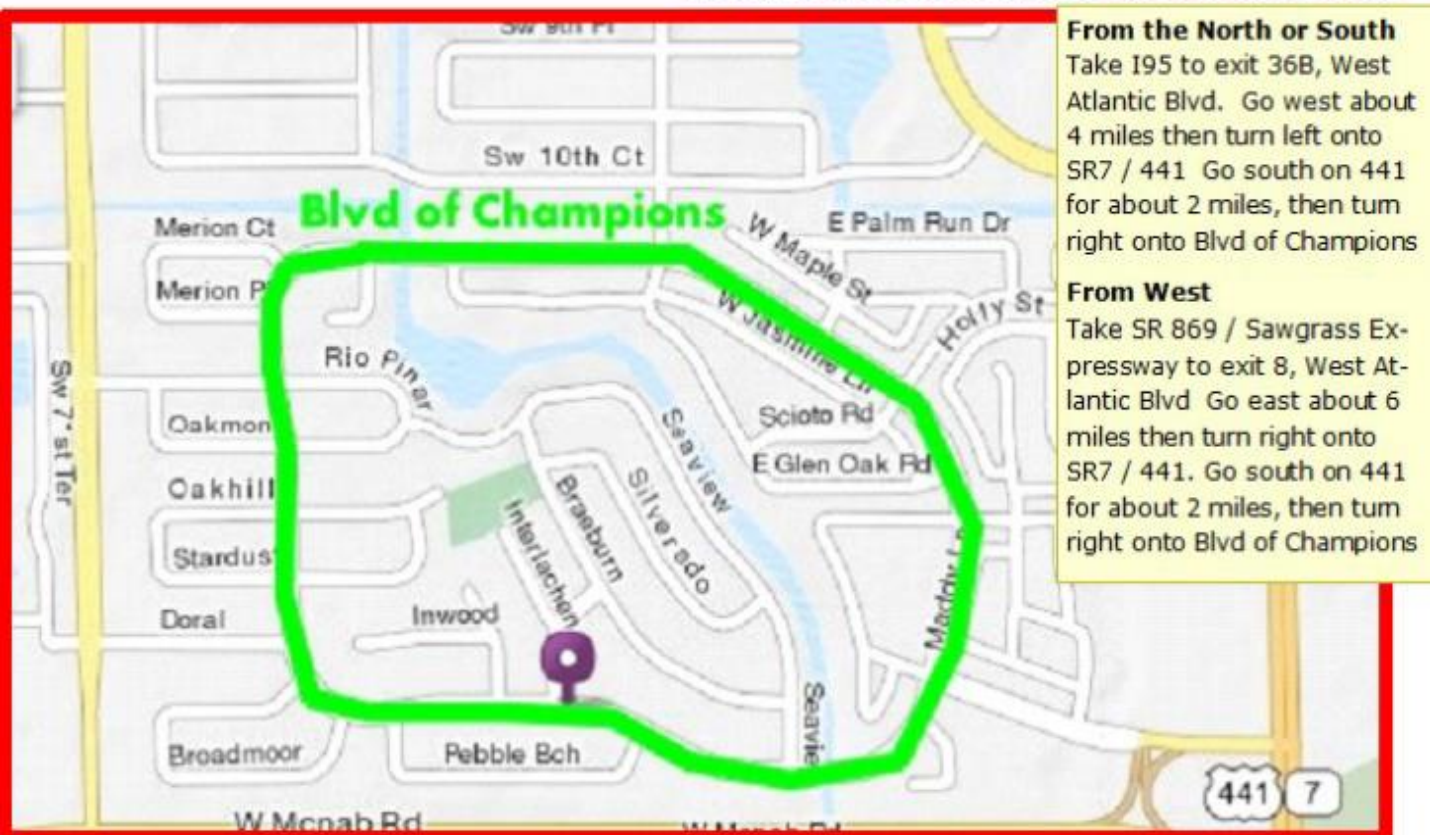
