On October 14th, Dan and Peggy Layton opened their house for us to enjoy their Halloween display, but that was not the only thing to enjoy, because her Black Forest Mousse Dessert was delightful. Thanks Peggy. Here is the recipe.



- •1 pkg. (3.9 oz.) chocolate instant pudding mix
- •1-1/2 cups cold milk
- •1 tub (8 oz.) COOL WHIP Whipped Topping, thawed, divided
- •16 OREO Cookies <u>coarsely crushed (about 1-1/2 cups)</u>, <u>divided</u>
- •1-1/2 cups cherry pie filling

Beat pudding mix and milk in medium bowl with whisk for 2 minutes. Stir in 1 cup of COOL WHIP.

Crumb Oreo cookies. Reserve ½ cup of cookie for later and stir the rest into the pudding mixture. Pour half of the pudding mixture in the serving bowl. Top with COOL WHIP and pie filling. Alternate with layers of pudding mixture, COOL WHIP and pie filling and add the reserved crumbed cookies at the end. Keep cold.

OPTIONAL: Garnish with toasted PLANTERS sliced almonds just before serving.


